DAY 1 - Wednesday 9 October

A 'VIKING' INSPIRED WELCOME | JARLSHOF | LERWICK WHISKY DISTILLERY

08.45 arrival at Sumburgh Airport

Morning cultural visit to Jarlshof Prehistoric and Norse Settlement

for a cultural visit. Delve into more than 4,000 years of human settlement in the same location. Neolithic people first settled at this site in Shetland around 2700 BC, and it remained in use until the AD 1600s.

Enjoy coffee and delicious home-made cake at Sumburgh Head Lighthouse.

Visit to Lerwick, the capital of Shetland since 1708 where you will partake in a guided walking tour around this distinctive and quaint working town. Today you will also visit Lerwick Single Malt Distillery producing Shetland Single Malt Whisky, a first for Scotland's most northerly, wild and weathered outpost.

Transfer north to check in at Busta House Hotel Dinner in hotel and relax in the bar Accommodation: Busta House Hotel









DAY 2 - Thursday 10 October

ISLE OF YELL & UNST | HAROLDSWICK | SHETLAND REEL GIN

Unst is the ultimate Shetland destination - the absolute end of every Great North Road in Britain, it has the northernmost of everything. It is also one of the most spectacular, varied and interesting islands in Europe. It is thought to be the first footfall of Vikings in the North Atlantic. There are the remains of at least 60 longhouses, the highest density of rural Viking sites anywhere, including Scandinavia

Yell is one of the three 'north isles' and the second largest of all the Shetland Islands. Covering 83 square miles, there's a huge variety of coastal scenery and beautiful beaches, wild moorland, small settlements, birds, seals and wildflowers, and history old and newer to explore.

Travel north by road with 2 ferry crossings during this journey, stopping also for coffee on route

- 1. Ferry from Toft to Ulsta (15 mins)
- 2. Ferry from Gutchen to Belmont (10 mins)

Late morning visit to Viking Unst at Haroldswick, where The Skidbladner (full size replica of a Gokstad ship), and the Viking Longhouse reconstruction are among the highlights Lunch in Victoria's Vintage Tea Rooms

Afternoon visit of The Saxa Vord Distillery, home to the award-winning Shetland Reel Gin and the most northerly distillery in the UK.

On route back to the hotel you will stop in a local pub dinner local folk music performance

DAY 3 - Friday 11 October

ESHANESS CLIFFS | VOLCANO TRAIL | TANGWICK HAA MUSEUM

Today you head to the "wild west" of the mainland to enjoy some fresh air, magnificent views and an abundance of history.

A must-see when in Shetland, the cliff scenery at Eshaness is truly spectacular with great walks along the coast. Eshaness is also Shetland's volcanic coast with fantastic geology.

Morning walk along the Eshaness Cliffs and Volcano Trail to explore, see and learn of this area with its turbulent volcanic past and dramatic beauty. The area around Eshaness is geologically fascinating; the cliffs show a series of lava flows dating back millions of years to a landscape of volcanoes, fire and lava.

Afternoon visit to Tangwick haa Museum where you will discover the story of Northmavine and its people inside this former laird's house which dates from the late 1600s.

Return late afternoon to the hotel and enjoy some time at leisure

A Final Fling!

Dinner in house with entertainment to include local storytellers dressed as Vikings and a small group of young champion fiddlers from the Island.

DAY 1 - Wednesday 9 October

THE HIGHLANDS - LAGGAN - EILEAN DONAN CASTLE - SKYE

Today we set off early from Edinburgh and begin our journey north, passing through the Kingdom of Fife, bypassing Perth and driving through the Highland Perthshire

A short stop at the beautiful village of Dunkeld for Coffee and freshly made pastries from the Aran Bakery and a short walk along the banks of the mighty River Tay. Travel Northbound, passing the Highlands town of Pitlochry and Blair Atholl, with views of the iconic Blair Castle. A visit to The House of Bruar, for some amazing shopping and lunch.

Continue north through the Cairngorm National Park before turning west at the village of Dalwhinnie, passing by its distinctive old distillery, the highest in Scotland. Admire the landscape transforms as it transforms into a patchwork of lochs and glens, unveiling the rugged beauty of the Scottish Highlands.

A short visit of the legendary Eilean Donan Castle, seat of Clan Mackenzie.

Pass Loch Alsh, offering wonderful views to Skye and its imposing Cuillin Mountains, before the short bridge crossing onto the Island.

Admire the stunning views enroute, the ruined castle fortress called Caisteal Maol, the small communities and the beautiful Island of Raasay. Your final stop today is Portree, the vibrant capital of the Isle of Skye, with its colourful harbour.

DAY 2 - Thursday 10 October

DUNVEGAN CASTLE| OYSTER SHED | TALISKER DISTILLERY| OLD MAN OF STORR SUNSET

Any visit to the Isle of Skye is incomplete without enjoying the wealth of history and clan MacLeod legend on offer at award winning Dunvegan Castle & Gardens.

A lovely stop at Carbost, the largest settlement on the Minginish peninsula. It is best known for the Talisker distillery, which has dominated the wide valley since it was built in 1831.

No visit to Skye would be quite so memorable without a short walk to the Oyster Shed. A local family business, with fresh oysters harvested daily from their farm in Loch Harport, the Oyster Shed serves freshly shucked and cooked Oysters with beautiful views of the Cuillins. Their farm shop has an extensive range of quality produce from Skye, the Highlands and the Islands, including fresh crab, lobster, mussels, oysters, venison and cheese.

Discover the Talisker distillery, the oldest working distillery on the Isle of Skye which is set on the shores of Loch Harport with dramatic views of the Cuillins.

Weather permitting tonight you will visit The Old Man of Storr. Arguably the most famous site of the Isle of Skye. Offering spectacular rock stacks and prehistoric landscapes, you will try and catch a glimpse of these beautiful formations at sunset...perhaps with a "wee dram".

DAY 3 - Friday 11 October


FAIRY GLEN | MUSEUM OF ISLAND LIFE| KILT ROCK & MEALT FALLS

Travel to Uig a small village on the west coast of Skye, best-known as the departure point for regular ferry service to the Western Isles. Take a short walk up and around Fairy Glen, a lesser-known attraction on the Isle of Skye. It's also one of the cutest places on the island to explore.

Visit the museum of Island Life and step back in time to an old Highland village. The museum offers visitors a unique experience and a true insight into island life a 100 years ago. This award winning attraction is a must for all visitors to the beautiful Isle of Skye.

Kilt Rock is a sea cliff in north east Trotternish Peninsula. It gets its name from the pleats said to resemble a kilt, with vertical basalt columns that form the pleats and intruded sills of dolerite forming the pattern. Adjoining it are Mealt Falls which fall dramatically 55m from the clifftop into the sea. Kilt Rock and Mealt Falls are definitely worthy of a stop and photo opportunity and a tasting of local gin, made on the Isle of Raasay.

Return later in the afternoon to then enjoy some time to explore and enjoy Portree A Sumptuous Scottish Dinner in local restaurant followed by live and local folk music in the local pub, will complete this wonderful stay on the Island Accommodation: Cuillin Hills Hotel



DAY 4 - SATURDAY 12 October

FERRY TO MALLAIG | GLENFINNAN VIADUCT & STEAM TRAIN | PORT APPIN | LOCH FYNE

After checking out you travel to the small ferry port of Armadale to board the morning ferry to the fish port of Mallaig on the mainland and wave goodbye to Skye!

You will through some of the most breathtaking scenery in Scotland to Loch Shiel and the Glenfinnan Monument. You will enjoy a stop and a short walk up towards the famous Viaduct where the Harry Potter Steam Train will pass over at exactly 10.45am!

Along the way you will travel through Fort William and past Ballachulish, the iconic and isolated Castle Stalker. Enjoy lunch at The Pierhouse Restaurant, a hidden gem.

A welcome coffee break and short stroll around the village of Inveraray as you make your way back to Edinburgh.
